#### Ethanol's Impact by John E. Krauser


Keeping our old cars running with most of the original gear can be challenging. As a result, many old cars have had different modern upgrades added. Some folks opt to replace the drum brakes with disc brakes and add a dual brake master cylinder for safety. Air conditioning is found in many cars and trucks that did not have that option when new. Seat belts have been added. Engines and transmission have been replaced or upgraded. Generators have been replaced with alternators. The old car industry generates billions of dollars a year. Just about anything is available for your old car or truck.

What is not easy to find is gasoline that contains no ethanol additive. There are stations in the Birmingham area that supply non-ethanol, but they are scarce. In my experience I have not found non-ethanol octane levels above 87. The problems with ethanol are not limited to our old car hobby. Fuel injected vehicles can have issues with the product as well. The Marine industry has been hit with ethanol related problems. Ethanol will absorb water if it meets the liquid or from the humidity in the air. Our Birmingham climate is prime with moisture. It is estimated that less than 1% water in the gasoline will cause the effect known as phase separation. Water due to its weight will settle at the bottom of the tank causing rust. The Ethanol is just above the water and on top of it is the remainder of the unleaded fuel. Under this condition the fuel becomes corrosive. Ethanol gasoline tends to vaporize quicker.

There are several products that help with the effects of ethanol in fuel. I have tried several and do not know if one is better than another. One of the Driver's Clubs that I belong to suggested Briggs and Stratton's fuel stabilizer is the best. That suggestion was based on a two-year study of four-cycle engines that sat idle for months at a time. (Summer lawn equipment and winter snow blowers.) Another club where I am a member uses the product Startron. Some folks I know suggest Lucas Oil products. Sta-bil can be found on automotive supply shelves everywhere in our area.

I recently assisted in rebuilding a Carter carburetor (WCFB). We found black pieces of the fuel pump's diaphragm in the bowl. Pump pressure had dropped. Brown pieces of dried fuel were everywhere in the carburetor. The carburetor was cleaned with spray cleaner and spent two nights in a vat of cleaner. Still, after driving for a few miles the engine started missing. Brown material was found in the jets. The carburetor was off the car eight times at this point. A suggestion was made about cleaning it again. We disassembled the carburetor again and soaked it overnight in a can of ethanol gasoline. (I know this method can be a fire hazard and extreme caution should be taken around gasoline.) That process was hard for me to believe but it worked. We used spray cleaner to rinse the gasoline off and reassembled the carburetor. No more issues.

There is a political side to the use of ethanol in gasoline. EPA findings over the years were suppressed when it was discovered that test results were not favorable. The Farmer's Lobby has proposed raising the percentage of ethanol in fuel from 10 to 15 percent. It is estimated that millions of acres of natural habitat have been destroyed to raise corn and soybeans for fuel additives. The process of making ethanol and using it produces nitrous oxides. Combined with sunlight this becomes ozone. When first proposed the public was told that ethanol would make the air cleaner. The result of ethanol has been an increase in pollution and food prices while decreasing fuel efficiency and natural habitats.






