Fire Extinguishers and their applications

The Dixie Vintage Antique Automotive Club meeting held in February included discussions on many topics related to our cars. One of those topics centered around the fire extinguisher. Most cruise-in's in our area do not require that each car have a fire extinguisher. Yet after some research I read where most Concours Level events and many smaller shows that judge and present awards require an extinguisher be placed outside the front wheel of the car.

In my travel career I have been able to attend a handful of car shows across the country. Fire extinguishers were present in some events and absent in others. An inside location sometimes required that the battery was disconnected as well. Fire inspectors usually have the final say when events are inside.

Here is a list of the type of fires that occur and what type of extinguisher is required:

Class A fires start with cloth, paper, plastic, rubber and wood products.

An extinguisher containing water and foam will remove the heat (water) and oxygen (foam). Also used on this type of fire is the dry chemical which removes the chemical reaction of a fire.

Class B fires start with flammable and combustible liquids such as gasoline, petroleum-based paints and solvents. An extinguisher with carbon dioxide removes the oxygen, and upon release of pressure, the CO2 removes the heat as the discharge is cold. Dry chemical can be used here also. Clean Agent Halogenated extinguishers include halon agents. More friendly environmental halocarbon agents also interrupt the fire's chemical reaction.

Class C are considered electrical fires and usually start due to a short-circuit in the system which is a common cause of many car fires. Clean Agent Halogenated extinguishers work here. Dry chemical extinguishers fire as they remove the chemical reaction required to cause a fire to burn.

Class D fires start by flammable metals including sodium, potassium and lithium. Keep in mind that the electric cars being developed, use batteries that contain lithium.

Dry Powder extinguishers work similar to dry chemical extinguishers as the powder separates the fuel from oxygen or removes the heat, but this extinguisher is only used to fight combustible metal fires. An overheated brake drum or disc would be an example of this type of fire.

Class K fires are found in the kitchen.

The Wet Chemical extinguisher removes heat and forms a barrier, so oxygen and fuel are separated. The discharge is similar to a mist that will also reduce the heat.

Carbon dioxide (CO2) extinguishers are recommended for our garages. Class "B" and "C" fires are most likely to occur in the garage.

Class B and C fires are also likely to be found in our automobiles, but the interior contains items that could be classified under Class A. An extinguisher capable of suppressing fire types A-B-C should be considered standard equipment in our classic rides. For years Halon was considered the best chemical available in the transportation industry. However, Halon contains CFC's that were thought to damage the earth's ozone layer. Halon ceased production on January 1, 1994. It can still be found, and it is legal to purchase recycled Halon fire extinguishers.

An extinguisher for your classic car should be either a Halon or Halotron extinguisher. The cleanup is easy, and the contents will not fuse and corrode hot metal. ABC dry chemicals will fuse and corrode hot metals. If you own Magnesium wheels or any large amount of titanium, then a Class D fire extinguisher should be on your list.

There is an alternative available that performs as well as halon. It is known as H3R Performance HG100C. The Halguard unit is lightweight and user friendly, and comes in a choice of finishes such as chrome, black or red. It can also be recharged. It has a discharge range of 6-8 feet. The unit comes in weights from 1.4 to 15 lbs. 1.4lbs is usually the size found in autos. I did not find a timetable for its discharge, though. It is pictured to the right. The list price is in the \$160-\$200 range for a 1.4 lb. extinguisher.

Yet another option for supplemental fire suppression is foam, which has actually been used in various forms since the early part of the 20th century. The Fire Command Aerosol is a can of foam that is safe and non-corrosive. The product will deliver a 10-foot stream for about 60 seconds. It is rated for "A" and "B" fires meaning that paper, cloth and petroleum (gasoline) fires can be contained. It is not designed for electrical fires. There is a shelf life of up to three years.



A cheaper alternative is your standard ABC dry chemical extinguisher costing around \$60. Better than nothing, the dry chemical extinguisher will fuse and damage any hot metal.

For most extinguishers mounting brackets are available that provide many options for its location.

I've listed below several extinguishers that have been tested and determined to meet requirements for our cars. The UL numerical ratings are as follows: for a type "A" fire the number 1 represents about the equivalent of 1.25 gallons of water; 2 is about 2.5 gallons of water; Type B fires, the number is the square feet that the extinguisher will handle. For example, a number 2 is 2 square feet. So, a 1A5BC rated extinguisher is designed to have about a 1.25 gallon-of-water equivalency and is designed to handle a fire not larger than five square feet.

A couple things to keep in mind. Fire tends to grow at an exponential rate. This means it spreads fast. If you are going to open a door or hood to reach the fire do not open it all the way as you are providing oxygen for the fire. Just crack open the door or hood and start spraying. While working in Las Vegas several years ago we encountered a small fire under the hood of a truck. We were able to spray into the wheel wells and extinguish the fire quickly. Hood insulation had come lose from the hood and fell on the hot engine. There was very little damage.

As our car events gear up this spring, the only fire we want to experience is at the tip of the spark plug.

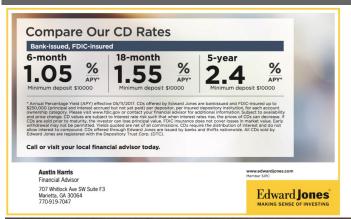


